

Who We Are

"Reformed" churches are, quite simply, Christian churches that worship and serve Jesus Christ. The Bible, God's holy Word, is the supreme authority in our church. The label "Reformed" is taken from the Protestant "Reformers" of the 16th and 17th centuries. The Lord used these Christian men and women to challenge the corrupted, "de-formed" Roman Catholic Church of that day with the basic teachings of God's Word. We strive to continue in the tradition of these brave Christians by holding fast to the truth, always "reforming" our own beliefs and lives in the light of Scripture.

There are many Reformed denominations and federations in the United States and around the world. And these Reformed churches are part of an even broader family of historic Protestant churches (Lutherans, Anglicans/Episcopalians, and Presbyterians). We are a member congregation of the United Reformed Churches in North America, a theologically conservative, Bible-based federation of churches. Our church was founded over 80 years ago by some Dutch immigrant families who moved into the Ontario area. These families were descendants of the original Reformed Church in the Netherlands, which the Lord had blessed tremendously with His grace and truth. Today, our church is made up of men, women, and children from many different ethnic and even religious backgrounds.

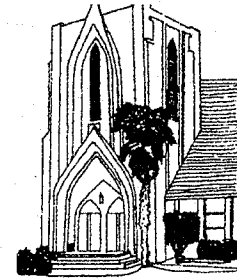

Visitors at the Lord's Supper

We are delighted that you have decided to worship the Lord with our church family today. At the conclusion of our service, we will be celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. If you wish to partake with us, we have two requirements: 1) You must be a professing member (not presently under church discipline) of a confessional Reformed or Presbyterian church, and 2) you must agree with the summary of basic Bible teachings found in the *Heidelberg Catechism*, *Belgic Confession*, and *Canons of Dordt*. Or, if you are a professing member of a confessional Lutheran or Episcopalian church, please speak with the pastor about partaking next time. If you do not meet these requirements, or you are not sure where you stand on these matters, please pass the trays of bread and wine along in the benches without partaking.

Please understand that if you do not meet these requirements, we are not saying that you are not our brother or sister in the Lord! Our elders maintain this policy because we are obligated to protect you and your family, and to protect our congregation as a whole. The apostle Paul says in 1 Cor. 11 that "whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord," and "anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself." As we seek to keep "good order" in all of our church affairs (1 Cor. 14:40), this policy helps us to be reasonably assured that you are a like-minded believer before you partake with us. If you have any questions about the policy or the reasons for it, please see our pastor, and he will be happy to speak with you.
